

Tuesday 26th Oct. 1965.

To mark the start of the National Chess Week a large number of Chess players gathered at John Thompson's New Atomic Centre, and indeed there was something to satisfy every Chess player.

ERI GESPIEL was once more in W.H. Seydel's capable hands, and quite a few players tried their skill.

A CONSULTATION match took place between M.A. Stevenson and Dr. N. Young & J.N. Sturrock with excellent commentary by D.A. Anderson. The opening was Ruy Lopez and after a very hard middle game, black finally forced the issue, congratulations Dr. N. Young & J.N. Sturrock.

There was a great interest in the Problem Corner and 12 year old Paul Weyciechowski was the first to submit the correct solution. Incidentally he is a pupil at St. Chads School, and he also scored 2 points in the Individual Lightening Tournament.

A keen struggle developed in the Individual Lightening Tournament. At one stage it seemed certain that E.W. Lees was to be the winner, but in the final round he lost to P.J. Jackson and they both shared the honours with 6 pts. each.

Eight teams competed in the Schools Lightening Tournament and once more it was a very hard fought contest.

Finally Wolverhampton Grammer School emerged as the winner with 6 points, closely followed by Queen Mary's and Bilston "A" with $5\frac{1}{2}$ points each.

I feel that every player who took part in this memorable evening would wish to say Thank You to all the Members of National Chess Week Committee for the splendid organisation and all the hard work they have done to make this evening possible.
